

# TOWN OF WILTON

## SELECTMEN'S MINUTES

Date: January 14, 2013

Time: 6:30 P.M.

Place: Town Office

Present: Chairman Steven J. McDonough, Selectmen Daniel E. Donovan, III, and William F. Condra, and Recording Secretary Pamela Atwood.

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 P.M. by Chairman McDonough.

Chairman McDonough called for a nonpublic session per RSA 91-A: 3,II(c) at 6:32 P.M. seconded by Selectman Donovan, followed by as unanimous vote.

The meeting was called to order at 7:07 P.M.

Selectman Donovan informed the Board that he just learned that Goss Park is not owned by the Town as previously thought; it is in fact owned by the Wilton Lyndeborough Youth Association. Jennie Goss deeded it to the association. Selectman Donovan spoke about the property taxes, saying that in the past the Town has always abated them. They may have to become part of the operating expense. This item will be discussed further in the future.

The paperwork for the lawsuit with the Town of Lyndeborough regarding the \$141,494 has been filed.

Al Preston of the Conservation Commission asked the Board for an update on the issue on Maple Street. Selectman Donovan was able to tell Mr. Preston that the boundaries will be flagged and there will be an opportunity to visit the site, to which the Conservation Commission

will be invited.

Next the Selectmen reviewed both the Recycling and Ambulance proposed budgets. The Recycling Center had a \$39,000 surplus this year which gets credited to the Towns pro rata. They discussed the compactor which will come out of the Capital Reserve account. The new generator for the Ambulance Bay will come out of the Florence Wheeler fund which hasn't been touched in years.

The Board discussed a note submitted by Linda Pajanen. She will be contacted with the Board's decision.

The Board reviewed the petition warrant article submitted by Donald Sienkiewicz. Selectman Donovan requested that a copy be forward to the Planning Board.

The Board read the letter from NTV, LLC and authorized John Shepardson to talk to Attorney Little regarding this issue and to stick with Attorney Little's opinions.

A letter regarding asbestos regulation was discussed. Selectman Donovan suggested that John Shepardson make these regulations available with all permits issued.

The minutes were approved.

Payroll for period ending 1/12/13 was approved.

One (1) PSNH Pole License was approved.

One (1) Veteran's Exemption was approved.

One (1) Abatement of Current Use incorrect bill was signed.

The informational material was reviewed.

The correspondence was reviewed.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting at 8:39 P.M. by Chairman McDonough, seconded by Selectman Condra followed by a vote with

all in favor.
