

# TOWN OF WILTON

## SELECTMEN'S MINUTES

Date: October 15, 2012  
Time: 6:30 P.M.  
Place: Town Office

Present: Chairman Steven J. McDonough, Selectmen Daniel E. Donovan, III, and William F. Condra and Recording Secretary Pamela Atwood.

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 P.M.

Joe Torre and Ron Caswell of the Firemen's Relief Association attended the meeting to discuss the Hand Tub. The Association would like to lease the piece of equipment from the Town so that they can maintain it, display it and store it. The terms of a lease were discussed. Selectman Donovan will consult with Town Counsel.

The Board signed appointment papers for a new Deputy Fire Warden.

Jim Tuttle and Tom Schultz from the Water Department and John Jowders from the Sewer Department attended the meeting. Jim announced to the Board that Bob Duquette has resigned from both the Water and Sewer Commissions. They discussed possible appointments for these two positions. Tom Schultz has been suggested to fill the Sewer vacancy and John Jowders has been asked to fill the Water vacancy. Selectman Condra suggested waiting until the Commissions' next meeting in case anyone else shows interest.

The Commissioner's talked about the billing issues, stating that they have terminated the relationship with the vendor of their previous software. Jane has been working to format the data so the bills can be produced from her office. They plan to use the Town at least for their next two billing cycles and they intend to remain on a quarterly billing

cycle. The Selectmen asked to have Jane attend the next meeting to discuss her billing software. Chairman McDonough asked the Commissioners to keep the Board posted on the billing situation.

Jim talked about future projects being proposed for the Sewer Department.

Chairman McDonough made a motion to go into nonpublic session per RSA 91-A:3,II(c) at 7:04 P.M. seconded by Selectman Donovan. A unanimous vote followed.

The regular meeting was called to order at 7:18P.M.

Donald Sienkiewicz attended the meeting to discuss Isaac Frye Highway. Donald originally spoke to Steve Elliott about his suggestion for the road and Steve recommended that he talk to the Selectmen. A discussion ensued about how to make Isaac Frye Highway a safer road for the residents while continuing with the paving plan that had been in place for years. Selectman Donovan suggested that Donald could submit a petition warrant article for discussion at Town Meeting. Steve Elliott will be asked to the next meeting to discuss the situation.

The Board asked if a response had been received from the Town of Lyndeborough regarding the money owed to Wilton. Town Council will be consulted for support in drafting a letter to Lyndeborough.

The cleaning contract for the Town Hall was discussed.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting at 8:31P.M. followed by a unanimous vote.
