

Town of Wilton
Water Commission
Draft Minutes

Date: March 31, 2011

Opened: 7:00 pm

Place: Wilton Town Hall

Commissioners Present: Charlie McGettigan, Jim Tuttle and Robert Duquette

1 The Board reviewed and approved the minutes from the February 24, 2011 meeting. A motion
2 was made by Mr. Duquette and seconded by Mr. McGettigan to accept the minutes as presented.

3 Voting: motion carried unanimously.
4

5 Bills were reviewed by each commissioner, signed and acknowledged as needed.
6

7 Mr. McGettigan resigned as Chair of the Water Commission at the close of this meeting. Before
8 Mr. McGettigan's departure Mr Duquette nominated Mr. Tuttle as chair and Mr. McGettigan seconded.
9 Mr. Tuttle abstained.

10 Voting: motion carried unanimously.
11

12 The back flow installation problems continued from last month were raised. Mr. Crawford went
13 before the town Selectmen. The Selectman reportedly told him there was nothing they could do for
14 him. The question was raised as to the location of the shut off for the Wilton Falls Building. Monday,
15 April 4, it will be attempted to narrow down the water line.
16

17 Kevin Anderson, of Meridian Land Services, Inc., presented drawings for properties on 37
18 Wilton Road, Milford, that would need to be tied into the Wilton water lines. Questions concerning
19 where water and sewer pipes should be placed were discussed. Mr. Duquette requested easements be
20 written in to the deeds of the properties for Wilton to access the water/sewer lines if necessary. The
21 relocation of two fire hydrants on the property were discussed. The Pennichuck water line was
22 discussed in reference to replacing the current frontage water line with new 12” pipe the length of the

23 frontage of the property. Mr Anderson stated he would be back for further discussion of this topic, he
24 could not make any decisions for the company he represented, and he was adamant about not touching
25 the Pennichuck water line or any of the soil near to it. .

27 The discussion of the rate change plan was postponed until the commission met with Roger
28 Trembly on April 1, 2011. Also in regards to the rate change, it was recommended to have a town
29 hearing, date and time to be determined, to dispose of questions that would arise from the change. The
30 hearing hoped to be planned and carried out before the new bills were mailed out.
31

32 Tia Allen of Island Street, Wilton, was served papers of condemnation. The Commission would
33 like to speak with Silas Little, Town Attorney, about recouping lost fees.
34

35 The S.O.C.'s and V.O.C.'s waiver due at the end of March, is still at the state level of approval.
36 The Town Clerk made the labels necessary to send out the notification fliers to those who need to
37 receive them.
38

39 The Route 31 pump station addition is starting in May as long as the weather holds out.
40

41 Rodell Mills water consumption/usage came to question. Their consumption was unusually
42 high compared to another mill in town. Question of the white building in front of it, and it's water
43 consumption needed to be determined before approaching the owners of Rodell Mills with any
44 problems.

46 Operation Maintenance and Response information paperwork on the new dam came from the
47 selectmen.

49 Motion to adjourn the meeting by Mr. Duquette and seconded by Mr. McGettigan. Voting:
50 motion unanimously carried.
