

TOWN OF WILTON
SELECTMEN'S MINUTES

Date: March 7, 2016
Time: 6:30 P.M.
Place: Town Office
Present: Chairman Richard E. Swanson, Selectmen William F. Condra and Kermit R. Williams.
Recording Secretary Pamela Atwood.

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 P.M. by Chairman Swanson.

Steve Elliott was first on the agenda to continue a discussion on the use of stickers at the Recycling Center in the hopes of reducing non-members from using the center and, therefore, reducing costs. Steve presented the sticker he is proposing to use, with a different color for each participating town. He has created an information request form that will be filled out when the stickers are distributed. He anticipates the program taking three months to implement. He will allow two stickers per household. He gave the price he received for 10,000 stickers. Selectman Williams asked if Label Art could make these stickers; this would be using a local company. Steve will check.

There was a discussion regarding whether to get feedback from member towns before ordering the stickers. Also, a discussion ensued as to whether to issue the stickers from the Town Offices as well as at the Recycling Center, and if there should be a fee to acquire a sticker. Selectman Williams stated that he did not want to charge a fee which would mean a change to our business model. Steve, also, did not want to charge a fee for the stickers. Audience members Jessie Salisbury and Charlie McGettigan joined the discussion. Chairman Swanson wondered how many towns offer free access. He thinks it's a responsible way to collect fees from the people using their facility. Steve is modeling his presentation after the Town of New Boston. Selectman Condra stated that he is not in favor of charging a fee for the stickers but he might be in favor of recouping the cost of the stickers, for \$1.00-\$2.00. Selectman Williams looked up how many towns charge for their stickers on the internet and stated that we would have to have staff to collect the money. Chairman Swanson conceded that he was out voted on charging a fee for the stickers and to selling them at the town halls. So the stickers will only be given out at the Recycling Center and there will not be a fee for them.

Letters will be sent to the member towns ASAP with a response requested by April 15th.

Charlie McGettigan gave his opinion of using stickers.

Public Comment: During Public Comment Jessie Salisbury gave her opinion that the center should be called the Dump as it was in years past.

Next, a letter written by Building Inspector John Shepardson was discussed. Chairman Swanson stated that the situation seems like a hardship. Selectman Condra thinks that they could appeal to the Zoning Board. The Selectmen would like John to include these options in his letter to the property owner.

The Selectmen support a request from the City of Nashua regarding having a mobile health van come to Wilton on selected days, saying it would provide some value to the public. The Fire Station and Police Department lots would be considered for the van to park.

Old business: Chairman Swanson reported that all reviews for Department Heads have been done with the exception of the Welfare Director Andy Clifford.

They discussed when during Town Meeting to present the Citizen of the Year award.

They discussed the Sewer Commission issue regarding the audit.

Motion: Selectman Williams moves to invite the Sewer Commissioners to a Selectmen's meeting to discuss the audit. Selectman Condra seconds. Unanimous vote followed. Motion carries.

Chairman Swanson signed the grant paperwork for the pellet heating system. Administrative Assistant Pam Atwood notarized the paperwork and will mail it tomorrow.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting at 8:04 P.M. by Selectman Williams, seconded by Selectman Condra, followed by a vote with all in favor.


