

## Understanding Zoning in the Town of Wilton

The Town of Wilton is divided into the following five primary Zoning Districts: Residential District, General Residence and Agricultural District, Commercial District, Industrial District and Office Park District. Each parcel of land falls within one of these five districts. In addition there are a number of additional overlay districts. Land in the Town of Wilton may be located entirely outside or within one or more overlay districts. Please refer to the Town of Wilton Zoning Ordinance for additional information about each zone.

# Opening a business in Wilton: *Where to Begin*

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## What do I know about my property?

Contact the Planning Board Secretary to determine the following: map and lot number; zoning district; is there an approved site plan on file; the most recent use of the parcel. For official zoning please reference the Town of Wilton Zoning Ordinance.

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## Do I need a building or other permit?

Yes if you plan to make any internal changes to the building space. You may also need additional electrical, plumbing or fuel permits depending upon the extent of the renovations.

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## Signs?

If you are adding or altering the size, shape and placement of a sign you must complete a sign application, available on-line, and submit to the Building Inspector with a fee. The application is then sent to the Planning Board and upon approval a sign permit is issued from the Building Inspector. If located on a state highway you must contact NH DOT.

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## Is my business allowed ?

Refer to the Zoning Map at Town Hall to determine which zone the proposed business is located in, then refer to the Wilton Zoning Ordinance to determine if the business is allowed in that zone. You will need to go to the Zoning Board of Adjustment if the proposed use is not allowed in the current zone, to request a variance. If you need assistance contact the Planning Consultant.

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## Do I need to go to the Planning Board?

If you are only changing the business ownership and keeping the same use you do not need to come to the planning board. Contact the Town's Planning Consultant if you are changing uses or making exterior changes to the building, to determine if you need to go to the Planning Board and/or submit a formal application.
