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16	Call to Order: Chairman Bart Hunter called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm.

24	was made by J. Beck and seconced by W. Mahar to approve the minutes. The motion

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27	Adam Royds introduced himself to the Commissoin. B. Hunter and J. Beck explained several
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	of the items and activites that the Commission is working on.
29	Discusion Reads D. Usedan indicated that the Decad is still used in a still section the section time durated
30	• Planning Board: B. Hunter indicated that the Board is still working on the project introduced
31	by Sam Proctor on Abbott Hill and indicated there is a public hearing coming up soon.

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36	• Forest Management: B. Mahar indicated there is one new timber cut on Lot E-45 for the
37	Society of Protection for NH Forests. B. Hunter indicated this is conservation land and the cut
38	is for maintenance of the forest to bring back the rabbit population. They are trying to bring
39	more light into the forest to help mountain laurel, which is great for establishing rabbit habitats.
40	B. Hunter indicated there is going to be a site walk to show the SPFNH is doing.

42	• Wildlife Sitings: J. Beck saw a flock of evening grosbeaks in her back yard. Other wildlife
43	seen was a possum, several turkeys and fisher cats.

46	• Horseshoe update: J. Beck indicated that she had hiked into Horseshoe falls. Her intentions
47	is to go the Selectboard meeting on the `17 <sup>th</sup> of December and ask them for a vote on the 3
10	secondrive. She indicated that S. Proster is propared to give the Town the right of first refusal to

- SSF: J. Beck indicated that the fair will be on May 4<sup>th</sup>. She indicated that it will the be same set up as last year. She indicated that we are sponsoring at a higher rate. She said that we would be pulling the pool of presentors and speakers to sponsor the Library Series. She indicated this would help make the attendance to each workshop better as there will not be an overlap of workshops being presentated at the same time.
- Library Lecture Series/Town Hall Film Series: B. Hunter indicated that Sandy LeFluer wants to doa film series through the SSF. He indicated that they have done a number of educational films on Sunday afternoon. B. Hunter als Jo indicated that they would like to do a series on GMO's around February 8<sup>th</sup>. S. LaFleur would then go into March on the subject of food waste. He indicated they can use the list of presenters from the SSF and have they speak on a Friday night on the subject relating to the film on Sunday.
- Topics for NHACC Board Meeting Dec 13: J. Beck was asked to sit on the Board of NHACC.
   She is asking the Commission for any topics they would like to bring forward with this
   organization. Discussion was had on this and options were left open.
- Inventory of riverwalk invasive plants and native species A site walk is being done to see
   what plants are along the riverbank at this time. A discussion will be had after the site walk to
   determine what plants etc will be used by the river as well as downtown.
- 81 • WCC Plan review and update: J. Beck asked that everyone take a look at the master plan for the WCC and see if we can opertionalize it. She indicated it was written by the NRPC, and 82 they gave recommendations on what they can do. J. Beck would like to update this plan and 83 make it operational. In the plan it discusses taking care of the properties in Town. A. Preston 84 asked if we were going to be responsible for all the properties not just the ones assigned to the 85 Commission. B. Hunter indicated this is why discussion is needed and then to go to the 86 Selectboard and discuss all those properties that are not being looked after. If a property has 87 a conservation easement, then it should be under the Conservation Commissions perview. 88
- Discussion was had on the best management policy for the forests and lands. It was
  suggested a list of all the properties in inventory be looked at on rotation, and a determination
  should be made based on the following:
  - 1. conservation and easements for town properties with water ways;
  - 2. property management for cutting and mowing
  - 3. leave alone and monitor

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Kiosks and trail work: B. Hunter indicated we need to get these done before the ground
 freezes or we are snowed out. A. Preston indicated that the trails, and right-of-ways are done.

- The only work left is to take down on tree at Frog Pond, and to fix the bridge. A discussion
  was had on the time and materials needed. A motion was made by J. Beck and seconded by
  B. Hunter to reimburse A. Preston in the amount of \$150.00 for time and materials for the
  brush maintenance of the community garden. The motion passed.
