To Transport Safely: Products marked Flammable, Combustible, Poison, Toxic, Corrosive, Caustic, Reactive, Irritant, Hazardous and Oxidizer are all dangerous. Leave in original containers, tighten caps/lids, sort separately (oil paints, pesticides and cleaners etc.) and pack upright in a sturdy box. NEVER MIX CHEMICALS OR SMOKE while handling hazardous materials.

Unacceptable Material: Empty Containers, Ammunition/Explosives/Fireworks – Check with local police, Asbestos, Batteries (any type), Biological or Infectious Waste, Commercial or Industrial Waste, Fire Extinguishers, Fluorescent Bulbs, PBC Ballast, Prescription Medicines – Free Disposal Days in Spring & Fall, Sharps or Syringes, Propane Tanks, Radioactive Waste, Smoke Detectors and Asbestos or Latex paint.

Procedure: **MUST STAY IN YOUR CAR.** Open your trunk, tailgate or hatchback. They will not take items from inside your vehicle. On a piece of paper have your name, full address and a list of items you are bringing. Keep it simple such as; 3 cans oil paint-2 half full/1 full, 4 spray cans of paint-3 full/1 third full, 2 gal. Gasoline, 1 bag fertilizer, 1 bucket driveway sealer- half full, 6 half empty cans of household cleaners etc... Indicate if this is your first time visit or how often you participate in the yearly event. Your information is vital to track who is coming and from which town. Volunteers will have a bag for you to drop your paper into. Thank you for your time.
FOLLOW THE ARROWS AND SIGNS for the location of the drop off area. Be mindful of the flow of the other traffic.

Volume Determination: The measurement of 10 gallons is equal to 2 units. A unit is 5 gallons or 20 pounds of waste or combination of the two; partial units will be rounded up to the nearest unit. Hopefully this helps in understanding how the 10 gallon limit is reached.
