

WILTON HERITAGE COMMISSION MINUTES FOR NOVEMBER 25, 2014

The meeting was called to order at 7 p.m. at the Wilton Public and Gregg Free Library. Present were Stanley Young, Michael Dell'Orto, David Potter, and Nancy Clark.

The October minutes were read and accepted after an amendment was made. The Treasurer reported there is no money left in the town account and no money had been spent from the private account. He said that the brochures are selling at a steady rate in various locations around town.

Commission members decided to meet on Dec. 23 for a regular meeting followed by light refreshments.

There are no new markers currently in the works. Stanley said he saw a sign posted in one of the old mill buildings that contained a good deal of relevant information. He suggested the Heritage Commission put up a sign down at that end of town describing the mills and the Railroad station and the railway roundhouse once found there. A large sign discussing the downtown fires is also being contemplated as well as one describing downtown businesses of the past.

Michael has arranged to interview Dick Putnam for the local history project.

Several Commission members attended a tutorial on the workings of the new town website and the Heritage Commission's place upon it. Commission members then discussed what the more informed members had learned.

The meeting adjourned at 7:45.
